WORKSHOP STREAM INFORMATION

This year, the program content for the CCEDNet National Conference-*Waves of Change: Building People Centered Economies* will be focused on three overarching themes:

- [Building Fairer & Stronger Local Economies](#)
- [Tackling Poverty & Homelessness](#)
- [Investing in Sustainable Communities](#)

Participants are asked to choose a stream they would like to follow throughout the two days of sessions. Particular topics within these themes will be represented on Thursday through sessions on models and information sharing, and again on Friday with a focus on action planning. For example, there will be sessions on Thursday looking at safe and affordable housing models and best practices, and a session on Friday looking at action planning and advancing policy within these areas.

On Friday afternoon participants will separate into three large groups based on the major themes. Building on the knowledge gained earlier in the conference, will work on elements of an action plan in those areas. The day will end with a celebratory reflection and planning plenary that will inspire participants to create real change when they return to their home community.

Highlights from workshops in each of the major thematic areas include:

Building Fairer & Stronger Local Economies

- *The Power of Co-operation: Discover how co-ops fit with CED*, learn co-op basics and realize how you might turn that co-operative idea in to reality.
- *Sewing and Sewing Together: Innovative Women in Business*
Presenters will share and discuss several women-centered CED enterprises in light manufacturing.
- *Inner City Revitalization*: Hear profiles of what is working across Canada, what are the key conditions for success, and imagine how to scale up work in the field.
- *From Social Assistance to \$15 an Hour: Successful Models in Employment Development*: Learn how organizations like LEF and Momentum have overcome barriers to employment to develop human capital.
- *Community Mapping, Youth, and Social Enterprise*: See how youth are re-shaping their communities through innovative social enterprises.
- *Strengthening CED: The Role of Municipal Government*: Through sharing of best practices see how municipal governments are using CED to create dynamic, thriving, local economies.

Tacking Poverty & Homelessness

- *Affordable Housing as a CED Strategy for Neighborhood and Community Renewal*: Learn effective strategies from Saskatchewan based recipients of national housing awards.
- *Asset Building: Stop the Cycle of Poverty!* Hear an overview of asset building approaches to anti-poverty work from a collaborative panel of engaged organizations.
- *Community Development Service Learning: Connecting Individual and Community to a Greater Social Movement*: Explore how the service learning model can create meaningful opportunities leading to poverty reduction.
- *International Partnerships for CED*: Discover in this day-long session how partnerships are creating an international movement for CED focused poverty reduction.
- *The Art of Mentorship*: Create greater understanding of how mentoring can create relationships that act as a catalyst for ending poverty.
- *Strategies of Place-Based Poverty Reduction*: Engage with the concept of local in this engaging workshop discussing place-based approaches to poverty reduction.

Investing in Sustainable Communities

- *Sustainable Food Security Initiatives for and By Saskatchewan's First Nations*: Through stimulating case studies hear how Saskatchewan First Nations are creating greater food security in their communities.
- *The Continuum of Community Based Energy Options*: Learn how groups across Canada are using Community Based Energy to create sustainable futures.
- *Primary Industries and Sustainable Livelihoods for Local (Aboriginal) Communities*: Explore the relationship between the resource sector and the communities in which they operate.
- *The Art of Advocacy*: Curious how advocacy could advance your cause? Discover how through presentations profiling various advocacy campaigns at the government to grassroots level.
- *CHEP Good Food Inc. - Twenty Years of Community Food Security Work in Saskatoon*: Hear from CHEP's remarkable example of community-led success and learn from other organizations discussing challenges and success in creating a national food security movement.
