


C-U Partnerships: Key Issues





- Governance (e.g., who decides which research projects?)
- Networking (e.g., are they building on and/or building new networks?)
- Definition of the sector (e.g., was the sector pre-defined?)
- Content of research (e.g., what topics, how do new topics get included?)
- Process (methods) of research (e.g., participatory content of actual research?)
- Capacity-building (e.g., university capacity to reach out, student and community training)
- Evaluation (e.g., who evaluates, when, to what effect?)




