Canadian Community Economic Development Network (CCEDNet) Réseau canadien de développement économique communautaire (RCDEC)

A non-profit national association created by hundreds of community economic developement organisations involved in improving the social and economic situation in their communities.

Membership

- Over 650 members, representing 7 000 organisations
- Community organisations :
- First nations, youth, women's organisations, co-operatives, immigrants associations and rural and urban organisations in each province and territory
- Public and private sector :
- Universities, foundations, consultants, financial institutions, federal, provincial and municipal autorities

Solidarity Economy

- Anchored in history: since the 19th Century, co-operatives exist, in particular in the poorest regions of the country
- Renewal and development in the last 10-20 years. Quite similar to the solidarity economy approach in Brazil.
- Links between the historic social economy and the new generation have been maintained.

Local Development Another definition

- Local development was invented in the USA and English speaking Canada in the in the 1950's.
- The notion is traditionnal and mostly (almost exclusively) aims in attracting enterprises in local industrial parks.
- No links with urban revitalisation or fighting poverty and exclusion.
- Therefore, a NEW CONCEPT was invented: Community Economic Development (CED).
- Except in Québec (francophone province), the concept of local development is not used in the same sense as Integrated and Sustainabled Local Developement (DLIS).

Community Economic Development(CED)

A territorial approach to development, started over 20 years ago, mostly in large urban poor neighborhoods across Canada, including Québec province.

Defining CED

Measures taken at the local level by the people to create economic perspectives in order to improve the social and environmental situation of the community, particularly for its most marginal members, in a durable and inclusive manner.

(CCEDNet-RCDEC)

A global approach


Since CED is an alternative solution to traditionnal socio-economic development, problems facing the community such as unemployment, poverty, job—loss, degradation of the environment, cultural and linguistic assimilation, exodus, aging of the population, have to be adressed in a global and participative manner.





Planning, Research, & Advocacy

A capacity to gather intelligence and then apply it to making or influencing decisions in the community's interest is a fundamental and ongoing necessity.




Accessible Credit

Without access to credit, people and businesses are blocked from productive asset building.




- Building Equity & Local Ownership

- Maximizing local ownership helps maximize local reinvestment.






Develop People's Capacity

Ranging from the marginalized to a community's leadership, getting people willing, ready and able to participate in strengthening a local economy is an ongoing strategic function.








Education

Access to and quality of education for children and adults influences the development prospects of a territory




Safety & Security

Social Supports



Accessible & affordable housing has a major influence on quality of life and the ability of citizens to adequately meet their social and economic needs.








Culture & Recreation
