Format

The Gathering 2024 will be held in person on October 25, 2024.

The questions guiding this year's Gathering regarding change in community economic development work encompasses a broad range of issues and approaches.

To reflect this, we welcome a diversity of programming ideas and formats including workshops, cultural programming, fun activities, networking ideas, and lunch and in-between session breaks. Proposals should consider the essential questions posed above and how it might interact with your proposed topic.

Proposals are encouraged to include interactive, discussion-based opportunities, and be mindful of clear take-aways and learning objectives for participants.

We will happily work with you on finessing your proposal to meet the event objectives and to deliver an engaging session.

Programming Suggestions

Here are some suggestions from programming proposals:

- Storytelling through fireside chats, panels, Q&A, or other formats: sharing stories of success, challenges, learning and growth, celebrating work and innovation (generally 1 hour in length)
- Skills and tools through workshops, presentations, or other formats: teaching
 others about specific tools, techniques, and resources that will support their
 community work (generally 1 hour in length)



- Theory and concepts through interactive discussions, circles, panels, or other formats: teaching others about core concepts and theories that relate to CED or the work of community-based organizations, including interrogating the questions posed in the event description (generally 1 hour in length)
- Creative or community building activities: creative activities to cultivate joy
 throughout the event, community building or cultural activities, movement-based or
 mental health-focused activities, or sessions involving music or arts (variable time
 length)

Topics of Programming

Programming can be related to one or more of these topics, based on the theme:

- Action, advocacy, community organizing, and activism for change
- Creating healthy and equitable workplaces
- Building fairer local economies
- Care for the environment and sustainability
- Collaboration & working together
- Embracing change
- Economic reconciliation

Audience and Logistics

The Gathering brings together 300 to 400 attendees. Participants may include front-line or management staff from community organizations, civil servants, funders, students, academics, and others, so participants will have a range of experience and knowledge about the topics presented.

Workshops and other programming are 60-75 minutes in length and can accommodate up to 30-35 people. If you require use of technology (computers, slides, use of video, internet)
